

Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Cancer Centre

Project Overview

Construction works for the new Children's Cancer Centre has begun.

The works will involve the deconstructing of the current Frontage Building and replacing it with a new 8 storey building (2 basements).

The new building will include:

- A cancer day care service
- Cancer Inpatient Wards
- Critical Care, Imaging and Theatre facilities
- Special Feeds unit
- A Roof Garden
- A Hospital School

Progress and Current Works

Environmental Monitoring was installed on the 5th February both internally and externally.

The main entrance to GOSH at the Frontage building was closed on the 19th February and the patients and families are using entrances on Guilford Street and Lambs Conduit Street. We can now prepare for the canopy removal.

UK Power Networks (UKPN) commenced planned works on the 22nd of February. These works involve in installation of a new high voltage cable in the carriageway along Great Ormond Street. They will implement a local traffic management along Great Ormond Street, including a stop/go system. The duration of these works is expected to be 3 weeks.

We begin our enabling works with the removal of the old GOSH main entrance canopy. These works are due to commence w/c 4th March. To facilitate these works, Sisk must erect a scaffold platform to accommodate the removal, these works are scheduled for Saturday the 24th & Sunday 25th February, and Saturday 2nd & Sunday 3rd March and between 10am & 6pm when the hospital usage is at its lowest.

To facilitate the safe arrival and departure of construction traffic to/from site, London Borough of Camden are undertaking highway alterations. They are currently undertaking work at Guilford St./Guilford PI. to widen the turning radius and relocate the crossing approx. 2m in an easterly direction. These works are expected to take 3 to 4 weeks, having commenced on the 19th of February.

Upcoming Works

Works taking place within the footprint of the hospital campus includes the installation of real time noise/dust/vibration monitors (completed w/c 19th February), the erection of scaffold to enable pipework installation (due for completion w/c 4th March) and the removal of the existing tower crane base within the service yard (due to commence w/c 4th March)

Tree pruning at Guilford Place and Queens Square will take place the week commencing 11th March, this is safety work due to the deliveries which will need to come into Great Ormond Street.

Logistics and Site

Sisk are limiting the deliveries to and from site as far as possible. The average number of lorries attending site per day will be five between February and May 2024.

Please note that Sisk site working hours are currently between 8am and 6pm Monday-Friday and on Saturdays 8am-1pm).

The DCMP (Deconstruction/Construction Management Plan) was approved on the 15th February 2024. A full version of this can be viewed on the GOSH CCC website or if required we can supply a paper version upon request.
